① What are the two types of conflict?

- ①. Conflict = struggle or problem
- external: struggle against other characters, nature, society
 - internal: struggle within to overcome fear or make a tough choice

② What is characterization?

- ② character's qualities can influence the plot of a story.
- "characterization" = the way to show what a character is like

③ What ways can an author show what a character is like?

- ③ ways to show a character's qualities
1. describe appearance
 2. describe speech
 3. show character's action/behavior
 4. reveal thoughts & feelings
 5. include other character's views
 6. describe qualities directly

④ What are inferences & how can they help?

- ④ make inferences to know characterization
- inference: educated guess based on evidence
